A Note from Pastor Todd...

Saint Valentine

Wait...it's Lent? Already?! This is one of those years where it feels like we have barely finished celebrating the birth of the Christ child and catching our collective breaths and it's already time to talk about the journey to his death! Being on several Pastor's Facebook groups has given me the opportunity to see comments about the particular timing of Ash Wednesday this year, which falls on...Valentines Day! At first glance a day which celebrates romantic love via flowers, hearts, chocolates, etc. and a worship service that emphasizes that from dust we have come and to dust we shall return doesn't seem to have a whole lot in common. I was aware that Valentine's Day originated with SAINT Valentine and it occurred to me that I had no idea who he was. So I did a little research. Allow me to share (from The History Channel)...

The Catholic Church recognizes at least three different saints named Valentine or Valentinus, all of whom were martyred. One legend contends that Valentine was a priest who served during the third century in Rome. When Emperor Claudius II decided that single men made better soldiers than those with wives and families, he outlawed marriage for young men. Valentine, realizing the injustice of the decree, defied Claudius and continued to perform marriages for young lovers in secret. When Valentine's actions were discovered, Claudius ordered that he be put to death. Still others insist that it was Saint Valentine of Terni, a bishop, who was the true namesake of the holiday. He, too, was beheaded by Claudius II outside Rome.

Other stories suggest that Valentine may have been killed for attempting to help Christians escape harsh Roman prisons, where they were often beaten and tortured. According to one legend, an imprisoned Valentine actually sent the first "valentine" greeting himself after he fell in love with a young girl—possibly his jailor's daughter—who visited him during his confinement.



Before his death, it is alleged that he wrote her a letter signed "From your Valentine," an expression that is still in use today. Although the truth behind the Valentine legends is murky, the stories all emphasize his appeal as a sympathetic, heroic and—most importantly—romantic figure. By the Middle Ages, perhaps thanks to this reputation, Valentine would become one of the most popular saints in England and France. While some believe that Valentine's Day is celebrated in the middle of February to commemorate the anniversary of Valentine's death or burial which probably occurred around A.D. 270—others claim that the Christian church may have decided to place St. Valentine's feast day in the middle of February in an effort to "Christianize" the pagan celebration of Lupercalia. Celebrated at the ides of February, or February 15, Lupercalia was a fertility festival dedicated to Faunus, the Roman god of agriculture, as well as to the Roman founders Romulus and Remus.

Lupercalia survived the initial rise of Christianity but was outlawed—as it was deemed "un-Christian"—at the end of the 5th century, when Pope Gelasius declared February 14 St. Valentine's Day. It was not until much later, however, that the day became definitively associated with love. During the Middle Ages, it was commonly believed in France and England that February 14 was the beginning of birds' mating season, which added to the idea that the middle of Valentine's Day should be a day for romance. The English poet Geoffrey Chaucer was the first to record St. Valentine's Day as a day of romantic celebration in his 1375 poem "Parliament of Foules,".

So in digesting all of this, we can *clearly* conclude that Ash Wednesday falling on February 14th is simply the latest attempt by the church to again interrupt a pagan holiday. Kidding! It is of course, nothing more than the way the calendar falls. However, as we begin our Lenten journey we are indeed celebrating love as well. It is God's love for us that was – and is – so fierce that there was – and is – no length God would not go to for relationship with creation. Even to the point of God's very own being born into, living with, and dying for that creation. So, as we start, let us remember that love – and also remember, "since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another." (1 John 4:11) May we journey faithfully.
