#### A Note from Pastor Todd...

"Do not remember the former things, or consider the things of old. I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it?" - Isaiah 43:18-19a

Happy New Year everyone! As we look forward to all the possibilities of 2024 I wanted to share some words from Rev. Ken Rummer. It is my hope and prayer that we all believe that new things are possible. Peace be with you.

"But why start the year on Jan. 1? Why not on Beethoven's birthday or the eleventy-first of July? Why not go with March 25 as New Year's Day, the tradition in England and its American colonies before 1752?

Beginning our calendar with January turns out to be a relic of our cultural roots in ancient Rome. They once had a 10-month calendar that matched the numerical prefixes for September, October, November and December with months 7-10. (Octagon -8 sides. October -8th month.)

At the end of December, their calendar inserted a to-be-determined number of month-less days leading up to March and the beginning of a new year. Eventually those winter days were divided into two new months, January and February, with January kicking off the year.

January gets its name, according to my sources, from Janus, the Roman god of doorways and gateways. He is portrayed with two faces, one looking forward and one looking back.

Though Janus looks clean-shaven on some ancient coins, others show him with a beard, a look the pandemic has made popular again. And did I mention the Romans looked to Janus for good beginnings?"

Today, few of us count ourselves worshipers of Janus, but we still look to his month for good beginnings. On Jan. 1, we dare to believe we can leave some stuff behind, imagine a better version of ourselves, chart a new course and make a fresh start.

Some of my believing, at the dawning of this year, draws strength from a few words in an ancient letter. "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!" (2 Corinthians 5:17 NRSV)

Here, the possibilities of a new year do not totally depend on my own choices and willpower. Here, the new arises from what God is already doing to re-create the whole Creation and even people like us. It's a new that shows in Jesus Christ, a new that can be glimpsed in those united to him.

This speaks hope to me. God's making-new is already working in us. And God's making-new goes before us into the year ahead.

So, what now?

The crystal ball has dropped in Times Square. We've raised a glass with Robert Burns for "Auld Lang Syne." Now it's time to turn the calendar page in faith and with hope.

Now it's time to make fresh tracks in the new snow."

# Life Line Screening Life Line Screening, the nation's leading provider of preventive health screenings, will offer affordable, noninvasive and painless health screenings at Sandston Presbyterian Church on Wednesday, February 14, 2024.

A package of four screenings to identify risk for stroke,



heart disease and other chronic conditions will be offered:

#### **Carotid Artery Screening (Plaque)**

An ultrasound is performed to screen the carotid arteries (a pair of blood vessels in the neck that deliver blood to your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke.

#### **Peripheral Arterial Disease Screening**

An Ankle-Brachial Index (ABI) test is performed using blood pressure cuffs



on the arms and legs. It is important to screen for PAD because it increases the risk of coronary artery disease, heart attack, or stroke.

## Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm (AAA)

An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery, which is a serious medical emergency.

#### **Atrial Fibrillation**

A 6-lead electrocardiogram (EKG) is performed by placing sensors on the arms and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related
