A Note from Pastor Todd...

On Sunday the 18th I preached on the gospel text from John where Jesus, knowing his time is short, gives the disciples a short imperative that the most important thing going forward is...love, saying, "I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." At first glance this doesn't seem like a wholly new commandment at all given that loving neighbor is something that went all the way back to Old Testament times. What we talked about in worship is that the 'newness' of the commandment comes in the idea and understanding that it is not our human love we are attempting give but rather, "the most abundant and inexhaustible love in existence", the love of God. That love is "a source without limit, without end." So in practicality, what does that love look like in the world? I found a few concrete examples in Audrey West's article in *The Christian Century* entitled "Ways to love one another". In it she talks about her recurring role as resident theologian at a summer youth camp. One summer they talked about this very passage from John's gospel...

In one of our discussions a couple of years ago we considered the ways that Jesus embodies God's love in the Gospel of John, especially Jesus' commandment to "love one another just as I have loved you." We imagined what it might look like for campers (and staff) to live into that commandment while at camp. Large pieces of newsprint scribbled with markers kept track of the staff's insights, to be captured later by my cell phone camera.

One photo in my collection shows a slightly rumpled newsprint with the heading, "Acts of Love at Camp." Below the heading is a list of ways to love one another as Jesus loves us, based on biblical examples:

- Let others go first in the dining hall (Jesus feeds the multitudes)
- · Invite others to join you (Jesus welcomes all kinds of people)
- Don't make fun of people who ask questions (Nicodemus)
- Encourage others when the challenges are hard (Jesus gives us the Holy Spirit)
- Make a friendship bracelet for someone, especially if they don't have a friend at camp (Jesus talks with the woman at the well)
- Offer help even before you're asked (Jesus heals the man at the pool of Bethzatha)
- Remind your friend to bring a water bottle (Jesus is the living water)
- Share your bug spray (Jesus would share his, if he had it!)

It turns out there are many ways, large and small, for us to love one another as Jesus loves us. Many ways, large and small, for heaven and earth to meet.

So those are some other people's ideas in their particular setting. As you consider Jesus' commandment and think about your context, how can you be a disciple and show this love?


Beginning Sunday, June 1st worship service will start at 10:00am.

White Elephant & Bake Sale Update...

Cancelled - White Elephant & Bake Sale - May 2-3, 2025

The sale was cancelled due to the lack of items delivered to the Fellowship Hall by our congregation and friends. There were several people identified who planned to bring some items during the week, but that was just a carload, backseat load or trunk load which would not have helped the two-day event. The PW decided to cancel the sale, and to announce a "No Sale" White Elephant Sale as a replacement. The SPC's PW Moderator spoke to the congregation on the cancellation and what the loss of funds means.

Background - What the Loss Means

The PW's focus is "missions," and its 2025 budget provides funding for 16 organizations or projects covering international, national, Virginia, Richmond, and SPC. The annual fundraiser takes place in the spring, and the monies are for the next year's budget— in this case for 2026. For the last five years of the sale, we have raised a little over \$2,000 each year (\$2,300 in 2024). The PW will be addressing the 2026 budget and fundraising plans in upcoming meetings.

Response of "No Sale" White Elephant Sale

The response has been wonderful with \$1,405 raised to date. We are so grateful for this support of our work! We will continue to receive any donations that are sent our way.
