#### A Note from Pastor Todd...

#### Psalm 23

It was around my sixth grade year that we moved to upstate New York because Dad was stationed at Fort Drum. Eventually we found a church home at a Presbyterian church in nearby Watertown. It was a formative time for me because a few committed adults provided me with my first youth group experience at church. It was also formative because my Sunday School teacher, Mrs. Sudduth offered a candy bar to anyone who was willing to memorize scripture. So it was that I received my sweet reward for memorizing Psalm 23. It has been near to my heart ever since.

<sup>1</sup> The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want.
<sup>2</sup> He makes me lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside still waters; <sup>3</sup> he restores my soul. He leads me in right paths for his name's sake.

<sup>4</sup> Even though I walk through the darkest valley, I fear no evil; for you are with me; your rod and your staff— they comfort me.

<sup>5</sup> You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows.
<sup>6</sup> Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord my whole life long.

This is one of those passages of scripture that has transcended the church and made its way into culture via music, TV, and movies. I would guess there are those who have never stepped foot in a church who would recognize "walking through the shadow of the valley of death" from somewhere even if they didn't know the original source. It is also, of course, an almost automatic part of a funeral service as well, reaching across denominational divides in that respect. The poetry is vivid and evokes emotions and scenes in our minds. I believe most of us can picture a time when we have walked through lush, green grass or had the opportunity to quiet our minds beside a body of water.



This beloved psalm, attributed to King David, has been a source of solace and hope for countless generations. Historically, it draws on David's own experience as a shepherd in the rugged hills of ancient Israel, where he cared for his sheep in dangerous and uncertain conditions. Shepherds in David's time lived lives of constant vigilance and self-sacrifice, guiding their flocks to green pastures, finding water in barren landscapes, and protecting them from predators. David takes this imagery and uses it to describe the deep trust he has in God. Just as a shepherd provides everything the sheep need—food, water, protection, and guidance—David expresses his unwavering belief that God is always with him, providing for his every need. This trust extends even to the "valley of the shadow of death," where God's presence and protection bring peace in the face of fear.

Elsewhere in scripture, in Matthew 11:28 Jesus tells us, "Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest." I think this Psalm speaks about that rest, that restoration of our souls, that God alone can provide. Writer and theologian Frederich Beuchner put it this way:

Like sheep we get hungry, and hungry for more than just food. We get thirsty for more than just drink. Our souls get hungry and thirsty; in fact it is often that sense of inner emptiness that makes us know we have souls in the first place. There is nothing that the world has to give us, there is nothing that we have to give to each other even that ever quite fills them. But once in a while that inner emptiness is filled even so. That is part of what the psalm means by saying that God is like a shepherd, I think. It means that, like a shepherd, he feeds us. He feeds that part of us which is hungriest and most in need of feeding.

As we continue to journey through life and all of its challenges, may we continue to seek God's guidance, trust in God's care, and know that no matter where we find ourselves—whether in green pastures or shadowed valleys — the Shepherd is with us.
